Hello (to one person)	Yasu Yah zu (an informal greeting is often just Yah, especially by kids)
Hello to more than one person and goodbye	Yasas Ya sas
Thank you (very much)	Echaristó Ef har isto (poly)
Can I have ...	Boró na écho Borrow na ek ho
The bill	o logariasmós o logar e asmos
Please	Parakalo pah rah ka lo
You are welcome	Pah rah ka lo
Yes	Nai Neh
No	óxi O hee

Good morning	Kalimera Kal i mera
Good afternoon	Kalispera Kal i spera
Good night	Kalinychta Kal i nickta
